SURVEY FINDINGS

1. <u>Employment Situation</u>

1.1 Among the 80 **MBA** respondents, 69 graduates (86.3%) were *full-time employed*. The distribution of graduates by Employment Status is shown in Table 1.

1.2 Among the 1587 MSc/MA respondents, 335 graduates (21.1%) were *full-time employed*. The distribution of graduates by Employment Status is shown in Table 2.

2. <u>Employment Sector</u>

2.1 Among the 60 full-time employed or self-employed **MBA** respondents with reported employment sector, *Commerce and Business* sector remained the largest sector employing 48 graduates (80.0%). (Table 3)

2.2 Of those 221 full-time employed or self-employed MSc/MA respondents with reported employment sector, most of them (144 graduates or 65.2%) were working in the *Commerce and Business* sector. (Table 4)

3. Job Nature

3.1 Among the 60 full-time employed or self-employed MBA respondents with reported job nature, the three most popular types of job were *Administration/Management* (40 graduates or 66.7%), *Banking/Finance* (15 graduates or 25.0%), and *Economic, Statistical & Mathematical Work* (2 graduates or 3.3%).

- 3.2 Among the 219 full-time employed or self-employed MSc/MA respondents with reported job nature, the three most popular types of job were *Banking/Finance* (50 graduates or 22.8%), *Administration/Management* (45 graduates or 20.5%), and *Scientific/Research Work* (34 graduates or 15.5%).
- 3.3 The distributions of job nature of MBA and MSc/MA graduates by program are shown in Appendices 3c and 3d respectively.

4. Gross Monthly Income

4.1 The calculation of gross monthly income takes into account basic monthly salary as well as the commission, bonuses and allowances (e.g. meal and transportation allowances). (Tables 5, 6 and 7)

5. Work Base and Frequent Travel Location

5.1 Among the 31 full-time and self-employed **MBA** respondents who reported their work base location, 19 graduates (61.3%) reported that they were based in Hong Kong, whereas the rest (12 graduates or 38.7%) reported that they were based outside Hong Kong. (Table 8)

5.2 Among the 245 full-time and self-employed MSc/MA respondents who reported their work base location, 221 graduates (90.2%) reported that they were based in Hong Kong, whereas the rest (24 graduates or 9.8%) reported that they were based outside Hong Kong. (Table 9)

6. Number of Job Offers

Among the 234 full-time employed and self-employed **MSc/MA** respondents who reported their *number of job offers*, 80 graduates (34.2%) received one job offer, 75 graduates (32.1%) received two, 45 graduates (19.2%) received three, 19 graduates (8.1%) received four, and 15 graduates (6.4%) received five or more.

7. Time of Obtaining First Job Offer

- 7.1 Among the 31 full-time employed or self-employed MBA respondents who reported the time of obtaining their first job offer, 23 graduates (74.2%) had obtained their first job offer on or before June. The percentage rose to 87.2% (4 graduates) by July, and 100% by September.
- 7.2 Among the 234 full-time employed or self-employed **MSc/MA** respondents who reported the *time of obtaining their first job offer*, 100 graduates (42.7%) had obtained their first job offer on or before *June*. The percentage rose to 100% by *December*.

8. <u>Graduates Pursuing Full-time Further Studies</u>

- **8.1** Among the 80 **MBA** respondents, 0 graduate *pursued full-time further studies outside Hong Kong.*
- **8.2** Among the 1587 **MSc/MA** respondents, 46 graduates (2.9%) pursued *full-time further studies in Hong Kong* and 18 graduates (1.1%) *pursued full-time further studies outside Hong Kong*. (Table 10)

9. <u>Internship Experience</u>

- 9.1 Out of the 36 MBA respondents, 26 graduates (72.2%) had internship experience during their study in the University. The remaining 10 graduates (27.8%) had no internship experience.
- **9.2** Out of the 769 **MSc/MA** respondents, 373 graduates (48.5%) *had internship experience* during their study in the University. The remaining 396 graduates (51.5%) *had no internship experience*.
- **9.3** Respondents with internship experience were asked to indicate the internship mode and the number of internship that they had taken. (Tables 11 and 12)
